
There's been much debate about the difference between uPVC and timber sash windows. Both materials have their own unique benefits.

What's best for your home will depend on your budget, expectations and priorities. To help you to make a fully informed decision, here are some of the qualities of both uPVC and timber sash windows.





COST

UPVC



· Cost effective uPVC sash windows are a more cost-effective window replacement option. Initial costs are slightly less than timber and there are no ongoing maintenance costs.



· Versatile - Three models in the Rose Collection, to suit different requirements and budgets.

TIMBER



· Cost Intensive -Traditional timber is expensive and only suitable for larger budgets.



· Wood Types – Modern softwood is slightly more expensive than uPVC while hardwood is significantly dearer.

· Standard choices - Rose Collection sash windows are available in seven woodgrain foils.



· Can be spray painted in any RAL colour - Almost unlimited choice of colours to choose from that never need to be re-painted.

TIMBER



· Any colour – Timber windows can be painted and repainted with a wide range of off-the-shelf timber paints.



· Maintenance -Regular sanding down, treating and re-painting is required to protect the window.

· Environmentally friendly - Sustainably sourced timber has a low environmental impact. It is ethically processed and is recyclable at the end of its life.



· Natural – Timber is a naturally occurring material. The imperfections of wood grain windows are unique to each individual window making timber sash windows a 100% bespoke product.



· Versatile – A skilled joiner can manufacture almost any size and shape of sash window. For an additional cost, they can also add custom moldings and period details.



· Low maintenance - uPVC sash

windows never need to be sanded down and re-painted like timber. With only the occasional wipe down with soapy water, they'll continue to look great and perform at their optimum level for many years.



· Durable - uPVC has excellent weather resistant qualities. It will never be compromised by rot or insect infestation and will not fade, warp, or deteriorate even when exposed to the harshest weather conditions.



· Sound insulation

uPVC sash windows' modern design helps to reduce the impact of exterior noise on the interior of a building. This is particularly useful in busy city centres and near main roads and airports.



· Suitable for listed buildings - Timber windows are often essential for replacing windows in Listed buildings in order to obtain local authority approval.



· Versatile – Timber windows can be re-painted any colour to completely change the exterior property aesthetic.



· Improved – New timber windows generally perform better than old ones. They can be double glazed and provide better protection than their single glazed counterparts.
